The Montana FFA State Convention hosted 10 career development events, general sessions, and workshops during the four-day event. Missoula FFA took home the Team Sweepstakes award, while the Flathead FFA earned the title of Star Chapter for the second year in a row. Montana's Star in Agriculture Placement went to Chloe Williams of Great Falls and Kacey Bertolino of Joliet earned the title of Star Farmer.

Over 250 Day of Service participants teamed up with 14 locations in the Gallatin Valley to lend a helping hand. Locations where members volunteered included Eagle Mount, Heart of the Valley, the History Museum, and several Bozeman parks. The combined work effort of these student volunteers totaled over 500 hours to improve the city of Bozeman, as well as community businesses and organizations.



Abbey Dunn – Corvallís FFA


For 50 years in Rural Corvallis, MT, the local FFA chapter was nothing but a distant memory, of bygone years never to come again. For 50 years, Corvallis students looked longingly at neighborhood schools with FFA programs, all while knowing that they would probably never have a program. Until 2015, when a group of students and a willing school board decided to hire an advisor, and a new generation of Corvallis FFA members were born.

For chapter president Abbey Dunn, the moment is overdue. "This year alone, FFA helped me make connections with people that are really important in the agricultural industry, both teenagers and adults," Dunn said in a recent interview. "It has impacted my life in many ways."

Corvallis, Montana, is part of the Bitterroot Valley region of Montana, classified as a rural area heavily dependent on

agriculture, according to the most recent U.S. Census data. The FFA chapter is developing the next generation of those agricultural workers. "FFA has helped me meet people that are changing the future of agriculture, and it is very cool," according to Dunn.

For 50 years, Corvallis High School students interested in agriculture have not been able to say that they are part of an FFA chapter. This year, that is finally changing. Already the FFA has impacted Corvallis in a variety of ways, and according to Abbey Dunn, that trend will continue into the future. "We've already set standards for the future," she said confidently. **"We've already planned out where we want the FFA to go from here, and we think we have a bright future ahead."**

CONGRATULATIONS TO THE

LITTLE BIG HORN CHAPTER!

Recently, the Little Big Horn FFA chapter at Lodge Grass High School received a

\$50,000 dollar grant from the Agricultural Development Council from the Growth Through Agriculture program. The chapter is planning to use these funds and other loan opportunities as part of a "hands on" learning experience in beef production.

As Ty Neal, the chapter advisor, and the FFA students explained in their application and presentation, this project will engage freshmen and sophomores by allowing them to purchase cattle, breed them, sell steer calves, keep heifer calves, and collect the proceeds in the form of a college scholarship after graduation. They hope to attract students who typically don't have the opportunity to participate in agriculture in addition to existing members of FFA. Congratulations to the Little Big Horn FFA Chapter!

Congratulations to our Helping Hands Grant Recipients!

Choteau FFA In an effort to continue to serve their community, Choteau FFA members have designed an opportunity to serve and cooperate with special needs students in their school by establishing a school garden. Classroom based lessons will be taught to the students on the importance of growing and caring for a garden. To conclude the season, a school-wide tasting party will be held so students are able to sample their harvest. Choteau is receiving \$2,100 for their project.

Lodge Grass FFA is excited to use their allotted \$400 to adopt a highway to be cleaned up three times a year. The result of our project will be a cleaner community. "They hope that others will see their hard work and stop littering so much when they realize what a beautiful community they live in."

Twin Bridges FFA Twin Bridges FFA was given \$1,500 to build approximately 20 benches to seat guests at the Sheridan County Fair. This will give the students the opportunity to enhance their skills in welding and woodworking as well as the sense of doing something to help others.

Hinsdale FFA Hinsdale was awarded \$2,500 to replace a community side walk along the edge of a park in the town. The sidewalk is broken up and covered with weeds, the chapter is excited to have a useable sidewalk for community members to enjoy the park.

Corvallis FFA Corvallis FFA was awarded \$650 to provide the community a place to rest when enjoying the Montana outdoors. They plan on building and updating the public benches between Hamilton and Lolo.
